- Treasurer (Kayci LeFlore): Total assets are \$76, 061.70. We paid a little over \$2000 for UIS Class Acts. Erin's Pavilion has been paid for the auction. Revenue is coming in from ticket sales for the auction. We have received some requests for classroom funds. Kayci said that she does not know/has not heard about how much we got from SkyZone family fun night.
- Program/Event/Committee Reports:
 - o Inclusion Speaker/Family Reading Night: Inclusion speaker is Ryan Hack. He will be coming Thursday, March 7th. He is doing two assemblies in the morning (8:45-9:45 is K-2, and 10a-11a is 3rd-4th). Notes on preordering signed copies of his book went out via email and will go home with students on 2/21/2024. Michael and Michelle will meet to ensure the wireless microphone is functional. Family Reading Night is Wednesday, March 13th. Jenny Wagh is the author, and her book is Eggosaurus. Notes will go home with students on 2/21/2024 to preorder books. She will do three presentations for kids throughout the day as well as a luncheon. Her presentation begins at 6:00 p.m., and used book sale will be before that. Kayci will take care of the cash box for the used books ale. Jamie Doering inquired if it would make sense to sort through the used books a day or two in advance to pull them for the Inchy Bookworm vending machine or if it should be done the day of set up. Michelle advised that there isn't anywhere else other than the vestibule to sort them or store them. It might make more sense to do it the afternoon when set up is getting started.
 - Young Authors: (Michael DeVos) Packets for this will be going home this week and an email will be sent out this week. Deadline to submit is April 5th and assembly is April 26th. Michael will solicit volunteers at the March meeting.
 - Auction: (Autmn DeVos) Approaching about \$5,000 in sponsorships and about 80 people who have purchased tickets. This seems to be on track with previous years. All class baskets and grade-level projects are covered at this time. Stacey

Cantrall and Jill Henry are taking care of these two items. There are some businesses that gave last year and have not given yet this year. If anyone wants to assist with this, please contact Autumn. Autumn sought feedback on Best of Live Raffle. This would sell approximately 20-30 tickets, tickets are \$100 each, and whoever wins gets to pick any live auction item that they want. Sometimes people will re-donate that item to be auctioned off in the live auction. These tickets would be sold the night of the auction. Question from Michelle Stehling: how many would you have to sell to make it worth it? Autumn: it seems like we would need to sell at least 10 tickets for it to be worthwhile, and that seems doable. Autumn will need help in early March writing descriptions and assembling baskets. Menu will be bourbon chicken and brisket, pit potatoes, mac and cheese, green beans, and signature drink is Mint Julep and beer. Solomon Colors is offering to sponsor the bar, and Autumn is working out the details.
